

# Intro to harmonica

# Holding the harmonica

- 1. With your left hand, make a duck bill pointing to the right fingers and thumbs straight out and parallel.
- 2. Pick up the harmonica with your right hand, making sure the harmonica holes are facing you, and the numbers on the harmonica cover are facing up.
- **3.** Tuck the harmonica all the way into where the fingers and thumb are attached to the palm. Your index finger should rest on the top cover of the harmonica.
- **4.** Keep all 4 fingers on your left hand flat Don't drape any fingers down over the back holes or you may block air flow, which will keep you from playing well.
- **5.** Put the pad of your right thumb on the right end of the harmonica.
- **6.** The pinky of your left hand should fit right into the crease where your fingers meet your palm on your right hand. Drape the fingers of your right hand lightly over the fingers of your left hand.
- **7.** Your right hand and fingers should not be touching the back of the harmonica, so you're not blocking air flow.

## Harmonica, meet lips

- 1. Relax your top and bottom lips, pooching them out slightly.
- Wedge that harmonica right into those pouty lips so the lips are resting on the curve of the top and bottom harmonica cover plates, with the end that is not in your mouth slightly tilted upwards, towards your nose.
- **3.** The harmonica should ALMOST touch your teeth, but never actually touch them. Explore making sounds by breathing in and out at your own pace.
- **4.** Lick your lips and see how your saliva acts as a lubricant, making it easier to slide the harmonica back and forth. See how gently you can blow to make sound.
- **5.** Purse your lips and whistle. Use that lip shape to blow or draw through one hole at a time. Can't get just one? That's ok! Keep playing around with it and you'll get it.
- **6.** Blow gently!


#### Reading harmonica tablature

Creating a melody involves blowing and drawing air through one or more holes in the harmonica. "Tablature" represents how to do this. Here's how to read it:

- Each hole is represented by a number, 1 10.
- Numbers appear over the word, syllable, or pause where the note changes.
- A number by itself means blow air through that hole.
- A number with a minus sign in front of it means draw air through that hole.
- Example:

6 6 -6 6 7 -7

# How to care for your harmonica

- Keep it clean! Set it down on a napkin or clean cloth when not in use.
- Don't expose them to extreme heat or cold.
- Keep it dry. Store in a plastic container only when it has had time to completely dry out. Whap it on your leg when you're done to knock out excess moisture that accumulates from playing.
- Don't eat or drink anything but water prior to playing so you don't blow food or residue from drinks into the reeds. This can cause them to plug up and not play.
- Don't put anything heavy on the harmonica it could bend the covers. Resist keeping it in your back pocket where you'll sit on it.
- Breathe gently. Blowing too hard can damage the reeds.
- Sharing is caring EXCEPT when it comes to harmonicas!
